Q2. Explain the following lines with reference to the context.

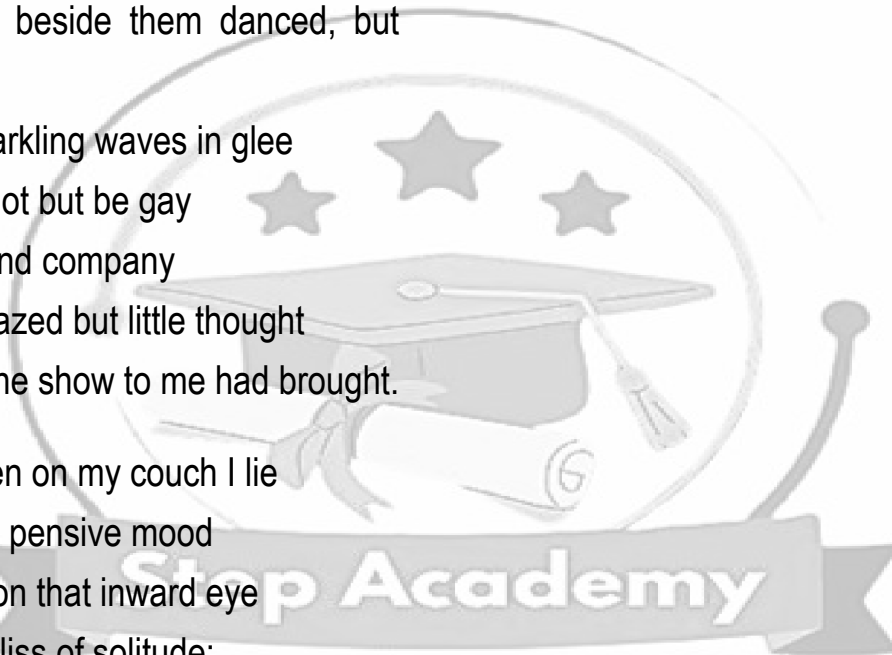
1. I wandered lonely as a cloud
